ABOUT ORGANIZATION

DEVELOPMENT & RELIEF DEPARTMENT

Development & Relief Department is one of the Sub-Department of Rongmei Naga Baptist Association (RNBA) Registered as non-profit, non-political society in the year 1985 and currently working in north east region of India Development is headed by a secretary and functioning with separate board member and identifying among the poor and marginalized. The major donors are Bread for the Word, Germany, APPI Bangalore and NABARD-Manipur. At present, RNBA could make its presence in more than 51 villages benefitting some 12,000 families with crucial development Interventions.

Improved quality and dignity of human life through enhanced access to entitlements, land rights, livelihoods opportunities and sustainable agro-ecological practices, with focus on youth and women in Manipur, India.

Objective:

- ☞ To enhance access to Rights and entitlements from the Government
- ☞ To enhance land rights with focus on women land rights
- ☞ To enhance Livelihood situation through green base income
- ☞ To promote sustainable NRM through Agro-ecological approaches

The activities taken up under Bread for the World (Brot), Germany are Enhancing access to Entitlements, Enhancing land right with focus on women land rights, Livelihoods Improvement (green income), Sustainable NRM through Agro-ecological Approaches through complete community involvement in the form of formal village level institutions and working towards democratized local governance.

Project is being implemented by 6 partner NGOs in 29 villages in five hill and one valley districts covering about 21,100 people belonging to different ethnicity and religion. The average family size is about 6 as per baseline surveyed. There are Christians, Muslims and Hindus, belonging to about 10 major ethnic groups, with dominance of Rongmei and Meitei, Kukis followed by Zeme. Project area population is predominantly poor, as evidenced in the livelihood profile of the baseline surveyed. Almost half of the households, wage labour are the main source of livelihood, followed by shifting cultivation and forest products collections. At present, settled/permanent farming is practiced by only 5% of the total households under project covered.

Over the last decade, the dependency in jhum (shifting cultivation) which has been the local tradition, culture and main food production system, seems to have reduced as per the land use changes sample information collected from project villages (2 villages as sample from each of 6 NGOs). While on one-side the land under jhum, forest and forest-plantations has reduced, the land under horticulture, wetlands (fishery ponds in the valley) and infrastructure project has gone up. This reflects the type of development taking place, with trend shifting towards income and economic development.

This change in land use has also impacted the local land tenure system. There has been increase in individual land and landless population at the cost of decrease in community rights.

Improved quality and dignity of human life through enhanced access to entitlements, land rights, livelihood opportunities and sustainable agro-ecological practices, with focus on youth and women in Manipur, India.

EED project has been working in 5 villages under Tamenglong District, for women, men, youth and for the community as a whole. EED project has been working and trying to enhance a sustainable livelihood for the people through various activities such as practicing of horticulture in a larger patch of land where women SHGs come together share their work, burden which can help one another. Cultivation of traditional crops has been regenerated and regeneration of forest products has also been carried out in all the villages. Revival of old good practices has been promoted. Market linkage has been carried out for the products produced by the community. During this year's EED/BRoT has formed a total of 5 VDCs and 16 women SHGs in project villages.

Why EED/ BRoT project:

- ✓ Poor and marginalized people
- ✓ Works with 229 families in five project villages
- ✓ Traditional practice
- ✓ Capacity building – helping hand in hand with village level institutions/ farmers group, capacitated for conservation of natural resource management
- ✓ Promotion of women land rights
- ✓ Promotion of sustainable livelihood
- ✓ Convergence with government programmes and schemes
- ✓ Best alternate to jhum cultivation

Objectives:

- ✓ To enhance access to rights and entitlements
- ✓ To enhance land rights with focus to women land rights
- ✓ Livelihood improvement through green income
- ✓ Sustainable NRM (natural resource management) through agro-ecological approaches



Activities:

Enhance access to rights and entitlements:

- ✓ 200 youth and community people participated the sports day at Matung
- ✓ Awareness raising on rights, rights holders has conducted at Phalong of which 45 people participated the programme
- ✓ 115 people participated the training programme on rights and entitlements

To enhance land rights with focus to women land rights:

- ✓ 11 terrace field, 5 homesteads and 3 horticulture fields of individuals in the village has mapped
- ✓ Focused women SHGs has been cultivating varieties of food in the community patch of land
- ✓ Stakeholders consultation meeting has conducted with regard to women land rights with various stakeholders of the district and with women leaders
- ✓ Land Tenure Certificate (LTC) has been developed and provided to beneficiaries

Livelihood improvement through green income:

- ✓ Handicrafts training has been provided to all the interest Youth from the project villages to enhance their livelihood
- ✓ 9 youth participated the training
- ✓ 2 out of 9 youth are really doing well in handicrafts producing good quantity of fruit baskets, almirah, dining table, flowers, hair clips etc
- ✓ 15 women attended the mushroom training and 2 women are practicing at home

Sustainable NRM through agro-ecological approaches:

- ✓ 29 women have promoted to cultivation of traditional crops in the project villages
- ✓ 31 women have promoted to homestead in the five villages
- ✓ 41 women have promoted to horticulture cultivation in the project villages
- ✓ 500 saplings of myrrh and parkia (tree beans) has distributed and planted in the village reserve forest are for the community

Outcome:

- Average and net income increased
- Trainees are earning an income of 1000 to 2000 per month

Enhancing resilience of small and marginal farmers in Manipur through agro-ecological approaches supported by Azim Premji Philanthropic Initiatives (APPI), Bangalore

The APPI project goal is to build resilience of small farms in 20 villages across 5 districts of Manipur (Tamenglong, Bishnupur, Chandel and 2 new formed districts Longmai and Tengnoupal), facing climate change and market induced vulnerabilities, for enhancing consumption of local nutritious food and ensuring sustainably progressive farm income of the vulnerable farming communities. The project is implemented by 3 NGO Partners- RNBA (Rongmei Naga Baptist Association), PHDO (Plain and Hills).



Objectives:

- Ensured Sustaining productivity of small farms with Improvement in diversity of and nutrition from food produced from it and months under food production.
- 30% incremental income from small farms
- Community well being improved, institutions functioned democratically, mainstreamed agro ecological (sustainable) farming among the communities.
- Improved policy & systems at village and district level for the small and marginal farmers.
- Civil Society Organizations take the system as one major development agenda among the communities on sustainable development of the communities particularly for small and marginal farmers.
- Enhanced capacity of the small & marginal farmers and Partners NGOs on integrated and sustainable farming.

Highlights of the year 2018-2019

- 'Gaithao Producer Company Ltd' registered under Companies Act, 2013 promoted and supported by RNBA and NABARD have successfully started marketing fermented bamboo shoots. Gaithao Producer Company Ltd is formed to serve the need of aggregation, sharing services, and absorbing price risks.
- To promote and create an avenue for the VLF (Village level federation) to enhance their income and to build confidence and view of self, RNBA have supported more than 2500 numbers of livestock comprising of ducklings, poultry and pigs to 10 VLF (Village Level Federation) across 10 villages in Tamenglong and Noney district.

- More than 400 women supported to ensure sustaining productivity of small farms and increase income from small farms across 20 villages in 5 project districts.

Project Activities:

a. Ensured Sustaining Productivity of Small Farms with Improvement in diversity of and nutrition from food produced from it and months under food production

RNBA is marking its final phase of the project. We are driven to build a self-reliant society among small and marginal farmers, we focus on creating tangible impact towards sustainable environment and empowering vulnerable groups and women to improve their livelihood. The project operated through 20 villages of the following 5 districts: Tamenglong, Noney, Bishnupur, Chandel and Tengnoupal.



- For activity SRI with Black rice and Khaichum, we promote black rice genetic purity by harvesting paddy seeds from better panicles (pure line selection) and then facilitating adoption of SRI and Khaichum in 20 villages. Khaichum is a small fish pit in the middle of a field is an art of fish rearing organically which also add to family income.
- Integrated Farming system is one of the most successful activities of the project. Through this activity more than 800 women were directly supported. The intention of this activity is to increase farm productivity by increasing diversification, resource integration and creating market linkages.
- To reduce the expenditure and dependence on chemical inputs, esp pesticides/fungicides and also to provide ecologically sound sustainable agriculture with positive impact on human health, nutrition and family income. Through this project, we promote production and use of botanical pesticides and microbial products in 20 villages. We have trained and supported women farmers to mass produce these organic inputs. It is to ensure quality and better use of resources.
- Set up a biolab for mushroom spawn production. Since the setup, regular production of mushroom spawns produced was used for all trainings related to mushroom cultivation.
- Provided 653 soil Health Card across 3 Partners' project villages' farmers. The



card indicates the nutrient deficiency, crop choice and also better soil management of the field.

- Increasing application of chemicals, climate change and habitat fragmentation are reducing the friendly natural pollinators and predators, which provide immense ecological services for crop production globally and locally. Through this project, we have supported 115 farmers to bringing back and reintroduction of pollinators and predators. Trainings were given and simple posters for better and faster adoption of the technology was distributed.
- NREGS through provision of individual farmer support around land and water resources developments and plantations, composting, livestock shed improvements etc. provide good opportunity to help small farmers improve productivity and production. Through this project, we have facilitated desirable planning exercise and follow up in 22 villages with concerned government agency to take up necessary activities.
- Millets and traditional crops/varieties have gradually been replaced with market influenced crops and varieties, which are often not really adaptive to local market and food systems. They also have higher chances of failure during climate change contexts. Through this project, we have supported 100 farmers in reviving millets/traditional crops to help revive better quality seeds of these species.
- With lack of support of encouragement from market and mainstream agriculture, local agro-biodiversity, which was often quite rich, is getting fast eroded. Through this project we are encouraging revival of age old activities of seed exchanges though seed fairs to promote, conserve and expand seed biodiversity. Till today, we have organized 6 Seed fair melas across 3 districts in Manipur.



b. 30% Incremental Income from Small Farms

- To optimize collective action, share and enhance knowledge, inputs and augment efficiency and more specifically to reach scale in farming and marketing, till today we have supported 751 farmers through SHGs from 20 project villages to promote cooperative farming of locally important crops.
- Set up 4 primary processing units in 4 villages in 4 districts to promote value chain development around agriculture commodities, especially in remote areas. This initiative is an attempt to bridge the gap in physical infrastructure.

- To ensure aggregation and marketing, partner NGOs from 3 districts have facilitated in collective marketing, temporary storage, visiting trader and negotiation for 15 VLFs (Village Level Federation) and a Cooperative Society run by SHGs women from Bishnupur.

- Realising the quantum and duty bound nature of Govt. funding, we have accelerated successfully in convergence with Govt schemes such as NABARD supported FPO, 'Gaithao Producer Company Ltd' , covering 564 women farmers as shareholders presently and spring-shed programme in 2 villages in Noney District, solar installation by SLECO Foundation in our project villages- Taudaijang, Kabuikhullen, Okoklong and Namthan, convergence with NERCORMP & MSRLM and SALT (Sustainable agro Livestock Technology) program through District Administration.



c. Community wellbeing improved, institutions functioned democratically, mainstreamed agroecology (sustainable) farming among the communities.

- There have been excellent examples of learning sustainable integrated farming practices created through exposure visit and cross learning. Through this project, 4 exposure visits and cross learning were organised for 3 partner NGOs' Teams and farmers.
- Considering the principle of agriculture extension, all such new practices/technologies and processes require a communication trajectory considering use of different medium. Therefore, through this project, 12 trainings of trainers and farmers were conducted on SRI, IFS, mushroom cultivation, bee keeping and cane & bamboo products in convergence with CBTC (Cane & Bamboo Training Centre), Burni Haat Guwahati.
- Considering the differences in language, ethnicity, exposure receptivity and knowledge levels of farmers across partners, trainings at partners' level for farmers were conducted to train and expose differently.
- With support from APPI, considering the need and impact of animated communication on the farmers, we have approached and developed IEC materials on SRI, IFS, Pollinators/Natural Predators, organic inputs, group farming, marketing to impart the basic information and knowledge to farmers, enhance their yield and in order to confront challenges.
